Memorandum of Understanding

The document below is pursuant to the United Nation Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous People and pursuant to the United Nations protocol for “Treaty” under the direction of the United Nations Protocol “Treaty Handbook” eISBN-13 978-92-1-055293-6. It is also pursuant to the provisions of the Royal Proclamation of 1763, as ingrained into the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms 1981, and into the Constitution of Canada 1982 and upheld in the Supreme Court of Canada Daniel’s v. Canada (Indian Affairs and Northern Development) 2016 SCC 12, [2016] 1 S.C.R. 99. It is also pursuant to the submission of a Comprehensive Claim to the Governments of Canada, HRH the Queen and the United Nations under simple signature, February 11, 2009 and resubmitted July 21, 1915.

The Corporation of the Constitutional Monarchy of Canada is under the Royal Proclamation (1763), mandated to enter into Treaty with Indigenous Nations before and lands or resources shall be taken from Indigenous people.

With the decision of the Daniel’s v, Canada, decision and the upheld provisions of the Royal Proclamation, it is now desirous of both Parties the Crowns and The Anishinabek Solutrean Métis Indigenous Nation (formally known as the Anishinabek (Algonquin) Woodlands Métis Aboriginal Tribe, to enter into Treaty negotiations to resolve more than 255 years of post colonial occupation issues (The Treaty of Peace and Friendship, 1713), on the lands of the Anishinabek Peoples of Eastern Canada.

Therefore both parties will begin earnest negotiations “On or Before February 10, 2019” pursuant to the United Nations Protocols for registration to the United Nations, designating the Secretary-General as the depositary for the Treaty.
